Parent Opinion Survey

Each year all schools gather feedback from their students, parents and staff as part of a yearly evaluation process in the form of surveys. They are the Student Attitudes to School Survey, Parent Opinion Survey and Staff Survey. These give schools important feedback about what is working well and can identify areas that need to be improved. It is also one way in which the government compare schools using this data.

This year students from Years 4 – 6 have already completed the Attitudes to School Survey with great results in all the areas of "Excellence in Teaching and Learning" and "Positive

Climate for Learning" with result all in the fourth quartile. Next to come is the Parent Opinion Survey which is earlier this year and begins next week. A random selection of 30% of our parents will receive an email (generated through the department's CASES administration program) with a login to complete the survey. It takes approximately 20 minutes to complete. We strongly encourage all parents who receive the email to please complete it. We would greatly appreciate the feedback as the information we gather from this is invaluable.
