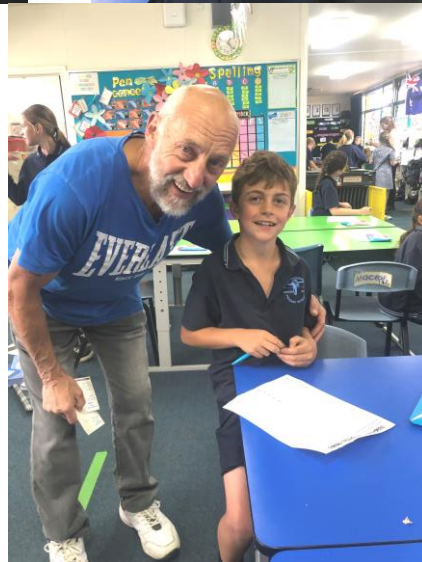
Dear Parents, Students and Friends of Seaford North,

The group will be run by professional singers and SNPS mums, Jacqui Porter and Mel Laverick.

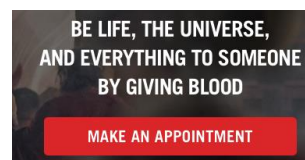
There will be three rehearsals leading up to the concert, to be held on Monday evenings from the 26th November. The venue will be decided when we know the size of the group.

Digital Footprints

As soon as children go online, their digital footprint begins. So what is a digital footprint and how can we ensure children leave a positive digital footprint?

What is a digital footprint?

"Your digital footprint paints a picture of who you are".

Your digital footprint contains all the information you leave behind as you use the Internet. Each time you visit a web site, you reveal some information about yourself. Comments on social media, Skype calls, app use and email records- it's all part of your online history and can potentially be seen by other people, or tracked in a database. Your digital footprint shapes what people think of you now, and into the future. No matter what you do online it's important that you know what kind of trail you're leaving, and what the possible effects can be. A negative digital footprint can damage friendships, relationships, and hurt job chances for the future.

How can we manage our digital footprints?

Make sure you know what the default privacy settings are for your social media accounts, and keep an eye on them. Sites often introduce new policies and settings that increase the visibility of your data. They may rely on you just clicking "OK" to whatever terms they are introducing, without reading them.

How do we create a positive digital footprint?

We are all in control of what we do online. We need to ensure we do the right thing by looking after each other, respecting all cultures and being positive to others whenever we go online.

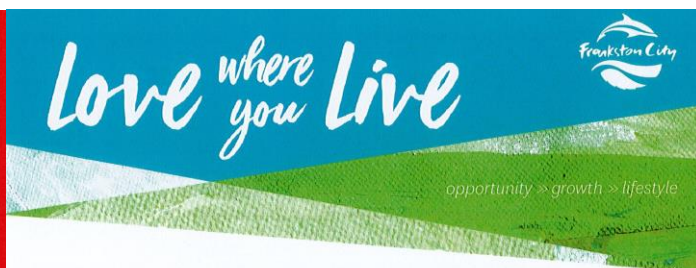
