We are pleased to welcome Sarah Jackson who will be taking visual arts for the remainder of the year.

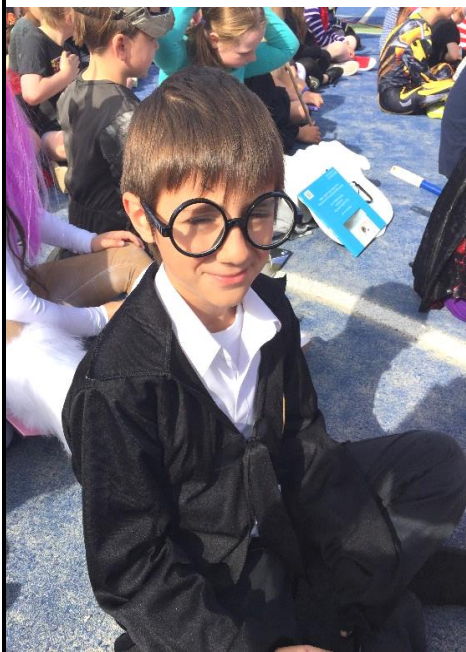

What is National Recycling Week?

(12th - 16th November 2018)

National Recycling Week is a well established and highly regarded annual education and behaviour change campaign. The aim of the campaign is to increase the environmental benefits, including greater tonnage and less contamination, of kerbside, industrial and community recycling programs.

National Recycling Week provides us all with an opportunity to move towards avoiding waste through building on our daily habits to avoid, reduce, reuse and recycle at home, at work, and in the community. National Recycling Week focuses on five streams:

1. Engaging students in learning about the environmental benefits of recycling, through the Schools Recycle Right Challenge.
2. Increasing the number of businesses and workplaces involved in recycling, principally through the promotion of the Friday File Fling.
3. Promoting reuse and recycling initiatives, particularly through promotion of council, school and community events.

4. Improving the understanding of kerbside recycling, principally through an educative Recycle Right Quiz hosted on the National Recycling Week website.

5. Increasing access to accurate recycling information through the RecyclingNearYou website and hotline, as well as the National Recycling Week website.

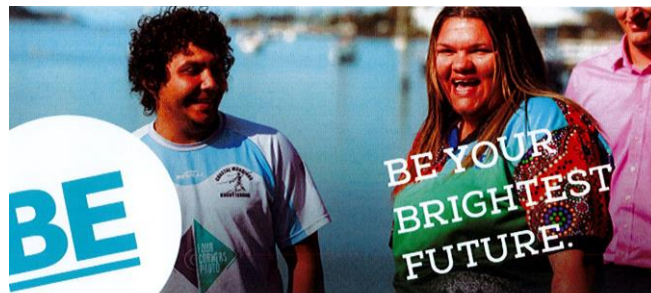

THE RESILIENCE PROJECT



Our SNPS teachers have been delivering lessons from the Resilience Project program. The Resilience Project delivers emotionally engaging programs to schools, providing practical, evidence-based, positive mental health strategies to build resilience and happiness.

Here is a look into what each year level has been learning about:

Our Foundation students have been looking at gratitude, particularly how they should say please and thank you to those who do things for them.

The Grade 1 students have been learning how to be resilient by discussing situations when they feel safe or unsafe and how their bodies react in those situations. They created a feeling safe comic to demonstrate the different stages that their body goes through.

In Grade 2, students have been learning about how to be grateful. They have been exploring what it means to be grateful or thankful and seeing how they can apply this to their lives. It is important to think about the things we do have, rather than the things we don't have.

Our Grade 3 students have been learning to recognise and describe different emotions and feelings based on body language and facial expressions. They have also participated in activities which encourage them to display empathy.

Our Grade 4 students have been describing factors that contribute to positive relationships, including with people at school and in their community. Students recognised it is the responsibility of everyone to support and look after each other in the community, as well as the importance of belonging.

The Grade 5 students have been complimenting each other. Students wrote on compliment cards for each other. They had to consider what they like or admire about the person and consider their strengths and talents.

Grade 6 students have continued to look at empathy. They focused on discussing why empathy is important and sharing their earliest memories of someone helping them. Students brainstormed what may prevent them from showing empathy and how they can overcome this.

We are so very proud of all our students. Their participation in The Resilience Project has been incredibly inspiring and we know that the benefits for everyone involved will be incredible.

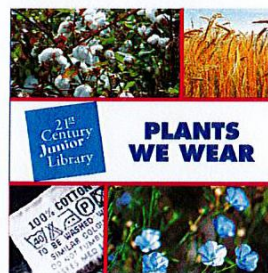
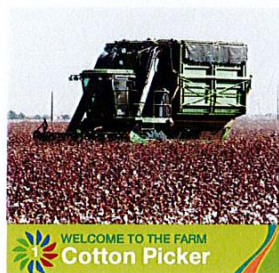

As part of our central idea "Many products go through a process of change before they are consumed or used", 3/4s inquired into the process that foods and materials go through before they get to our homes.

We read the books "Cotton Pickers" and "Plants We Wear" in reading workshops which told us how cotton plants turn into the cotton in our clothes.



Following from this, we wanted to further process cotton. We got donations of cotton wool and used fabric dye to colour our cotton. We were amazed at how vibrant our colours turned out! Once our cotton had been dyed and dried, it was time to weave it into something special.

ARE YOU A SHARENT?

Parents often get conflicting advice about whether or not it's ok for them to take and share their children's images online. Some parents share images readily. Others hold back because they worry that their children might be embarrassed later on or that posting images of their children online potentially exposes their family to harm.

Sharenting (or **oversharenting**) is a term used to describe the overuse of social media by parents to share content based on their children.

Posting pictures of children online is something many parents do. In a recent report, *Preparing for a Digital Future*, three-quarters of parents who use the internet, at least monthly, share photographs or videos of their children online. The authors interviewed several families where even small children wished their parents would share fewer photos, and consult them more. They observed in a few families that children are even learning to tell their parents to stop.

TIPS for parents

Ask your child's permission before posting content about them.

Tell them who you will be sharing it with.

Remember what you post may form part of your child's permanent digital footprint.

Model the online behaviour you expect your child to follow.
