Disable location services


Make sure location services on Smart Phone's and iPad's are disabled by accessing—Settings, Privacy and Location services, and toggle the button to off.

You can set up an iTunes account for your child under a Family Sharing account. Children under 13 years are not permitted to hold their own account, so this is a great option if you want to allow your child access to iTunes themselves, but still wish to monitor their activity.
