Principal's Report

Hello everyone and welcome back to Term 3! We're sure that it will be another busy term filled with lots of exciting events and activities for our students and our whole community to become involved in.

Staff Update

We welcome Melanie Hagart, Sandy Liddiard and Richard Press (welcome back!) to Seaford North PS. These teachers have been employed as Learning Enhancement Teachers to provide support across the school; intervention and extension support including the Fountas & Pinnell Levelled Literacy Intervention Program.

Welcome also to Georgia Scott who has taken over 5/6W whilst Tara Williams is in the Acting Assistant Principal position for this term.

Staff Professional Development

Our ongoing Professional Development is continuing this term with a team of teachers attending Bastow Institute of Educational Research – Leading Mathematics course. As mentioned on previous occasions, this course is designed to enhance mathematical learning and achievement for our students. The course also focuses on enhancing the knowledge, capabilities and leadership skills of our teachers in a collegial and supportive manner.

Throughout the term, staff will also continue to actively participate in weekly Professional Development sessions through staff, unit and sub-school meetings.

International Baccalaureate – Primary Years Programme

We are very excited that our Grade 6 students will be involved in The PYP Exhibition this term. The teachers and students are working hard to prepare for this event. The PYP Exhibition will be a culmination of their learning journey through their primary schooling. Students will have the opportunity to demonstrate their inquiry understandings and The Learner Profile Attributes. Through their growing understanding of the issue, students identify possible actions that could be taken as a result of their learning.

There will also be an open afternoon later on in the term. Students will be able to present their learning to the wider community and parents/guardians will be invited to attend; Week 9, Term 3 – date and time to be confirmed and communicated to parents – stay tuned!

Parent Opinion Survey

The Parent Opinion Survey began this week. A random selection of 30% of our parents have received a letter (generated through our Department's CASES21 administration program). Parents have been issued with a login to complete the survey. We strongly encourage all parents who receive the letter to complete the survey as the feedback we receive from this is extremely valuable.





Healthy little MasterChefs

Mexican Bean and Corn Dip
