

English

This term in Writing we will be starting with a focus on recount writing before moving into narrative writing later in the term. The use of VCOP (Vocabulary, Connectives, Openers, Punctuation) will be integrated into our program, encouraging students to up-level their writing using more interesting language and sentence structure.

Reading workshops are underway in Grade 1 where we have started learning about how to pick 'Just Right' books and how to read to ourselves with stamina and to someone else.

Reading workshops will continue throughout the term with focuses on improving our vocabulary, reading fluency and decoding as well as comprehension.



Mathematics

This term in Mathematics we will have a focus on our number skills with weekly counting lessons, as well as learning more about place value, addition and subtraction. Outside of Number, we will be exploring 2D shapes, days and months of the year and chance.

We will also be working on our problem solving skills using our whole school approach called CUBES. CUBES assists students to break down worded maths problems to simplify what the question is asking and guide them towards choosing a strategy to solve. The strategy we will work on this term is drawing a diagram.

Dojo

Class Dojo is a tool teachers use to communicate class information, photos and direct messaging between teacher and parents. It is a free app, or can be used online. Forms have been sent home with instructions to sign up and log into your child's class account if you are not already connected. It is advised that you take advantage of this tool to keep in touch with what occurs in the classroom throughout the year. Speaking and Listening

Show and Tell is a great speaking and listening opportunity for young children. It consists of short informal speaking to an audience about simple topics. Show and Tell also aids in the development of the students' expressive language. To assist the children to get the most out of the experience, we have provided a weekly focus. Discussing your child's show and tell with them prior to presenting will also help them to continue to develop their confidence. This term children will bring a special item to share that links to numerous phonemes. Ask children to think of something to share that links in with the phoneme. If any questions please ask any of the teachers.
