
UNIT OF INQUIRY

- Collecting, understanding and using data


We'd like to congratulate the students on their wonderful work in our previous inquiry unit, **How We Organise Ourselves**. Check out their creations!



MATHEMATICS

This term in Mathematics, students will explore common uses of halves, quarters and eighths of shapes and collections. We will further explore number patterns of 2, 3, 5 and 10 and refine their ability to write, recognise, represent and order numbers to 1000 using hands-on materials.

Students will also be revising their knowledge and skills regarding the measurement of length, area, capacity, volume and time.



LITERACY


In Writing this term, our students will be revisiting narrative writing and exploring letter writing.

In the narrative writing unit, students will experiment with imaginative ideas and practise writing creative and descriptive settings, characters, problems, solutions and endings. Students will then learn to write and respond to questions and correctly write addresses in our letter writing unit.

Students will continue to participate in the SMART spelling program where they will investigate a new spelling focus each week.

In Reading, students will continue to expand their vocabulary as they tune into interesting words, define these words and explore synonyms. As well as this, there will be a focus on improving reading aloud as the students investigate dialogue and onomatopoeia. Students will also build their comprehension skills and focus on strategies to sequence and summarise the texts they read.
