#### What is an IB Education?

An IB education fosters creativity and imagination. It offers students opportunities for considering the nature of human thought and for developing the skills and commitments necessary not only to remember, but also to analyse one's own thinking and effort – as well as the products and performances that grow from them. Through inquiry, action and reflection, the IB programme aims to develop a range of competencies and dispositions that include skills for thinking, working with others, communicating, self-management and research.

#### Teaching and Learning in the IB

This constructivist approach leads towards open, democratic classrooms through the interaction of asking, doing and thinking. An IB education empowers young people for a lifetime of learning, independently and in collaboration with others. It prepares a community of learners to engage with global challenges through inquiry, action and reflection.

#### Inquiry

The IB programme features structured inquiry into established bodies of knowledge and into complex problems.

#### Action

Principled action, as both a strategy and an outcome, represents the IB's commitment to teaching and learning through practical, real-world experience. Action in the IB programme may involve service learning, advocacy, and educating self and others.

#### Reflection

Critical reflection is the process by which curiosity and experience can lead to deeper understanding.

The IB Primary Years Programme (PYP) is a curriculum framework designed for students aged 5 to 12. It focuses on the development of the whole child as an inquirer, both in the classroom and in the world outside. It is defined by six transdisciplinary themes of global significance, explored using knowledge and skills derived from six subject areas, with a powerful emphasis on inquiry-based learning.



The PYP framework fully accommodates the demands of our national and Victorian curriculum.

#### The IB Primary Years Programme:

- Addresses students' academic, social and emotional well-being.
- Encourages students to develop independence and to take responsibility for their own learning.
- Supports students' efforts to gain understanding of the world and to function comfortably within it.
- Helps students establish personal values as a foundation upon which international-mindedness will develop and flourish.

An aim of the PYP is to create a transdisciplinary curriculum that is engaging, relevant, challenging and significant for learners in the 5-12 age range.

School Councils have a number of roles and responsibilities arising out of their designated powers. In summary these roles are:

- Developing the School Strategic Plan.
- Determining the general educational policy, goals and priorities of the school within the framework of the school strategic plan and statewide guidelines.
- Monitoring and evaluating the performance of the school in relation to the goals and priorities in the School Strategic Plan, including participation in review processes.
- Reporting annually to the school community and the Department.
- Approving and monitoring the school budget (including school-generated funds) which needs to be consistent with the school charter.
- Ensuring that all monies coming into the hands of the council are expended for proper purposes.
- Making recommendations to the Secretary on the appointment of the school principal.
- Entering contracts for purposes consistent with the School Strategic Plan.
- Employing non-teaching staff and any casual relief teachers or contracting for the provision of those services.
- Exercising a general oversight of the buildings and grounds and ensuring that they are kept in good order and condition.
- Generally stimulating interest in the school.
- Be on at least one Council Sub Committee.

### Reminders from the Office

#### Late Arrivals

If your child/ren arrive after 9:00am please make sure you come to the office to get a late pass. Parents are able to sign their children in using the Compass Kiosk. The late pass slip can then be taken to the teacher in the classroom. Any children who arrive after 9:00am and do not come to the office for a late pass will be marked as absent and a message will be sent home to parents notifying them that their child is not at school.

#### Early Collection

Should you need to pick your student up early from school on any day, please let the office staff know and they will pass the message on to the teacher - teachers are not always free to check or respond to messages during the day.

You will need to attend the office to sign out your student either on the Compass Kiosk or with the office staff, then you can collect your student from their classroom.

Recess is from 10.40am to 11.10am – we recommend you come prior to 10.35am Lunch is from 1.00pm to 1.50pm – we recommend you come prior to 12.55pm

If you need to collect your student between 3.10pm and 3.30pm, please come to the office before 3.10pm as the end of school days are particularly busy.

If you would like someone else to collect your student, please ensure they are either listed as an emergency contact or you have let office staff know who they are. They will also need to bring ID

#### School Sport Victoria Team Online Registration Process.

#### 12 Years and Under

Registration for trials for AFL, Cricket, Golf, Netball, Soccer, Hockey, Rugby, Softball and Basketball for state teams are now open.

The SSV website <a href="https://www.ssv.vic.edu.au">www.ssv.vic.edu.au</a> provides important information and a video on the process as well as application forms and must be visited.

#### Key points include:

- 1. Parents must consult with their Sport Teacher/Coordinator at the school to ensure their child has a high skill level to trial and represent their school.
- 2. It is imperative that teachers will decide on your child's capability of representing their school at a state level **before** registering online.
- 3. This discussion with the school Sport Teacher is necessary as all students **MUST** get the Sport Teacher/Coordinator and the Principal signature on their registration form prior to attending a trial.
- 4. The Eventbrite ticket, application form signed by the Principal and Sport Teacher/Coordinator and proof of payment must be handed to the Division Trial Coordinator on the day of the trial.
- 5. Applicants will be notified of arrangements for the Division trial once registrations have closed.

# **At Seaford Nth Primary** Starting Term 1, 2023!

Tenny. Noel has been teaching for more than 25 years , and has performed both nationally & internationally. Past band include - Frankie J Holden, Bjorn Again, Pean, Captain Spalding. Noel is currently playing & touring with both "The Australian INXS show" , and the Bon Jovi Tribute "Blaze of Glory". He also plays in wedding band, The Baker boys.

Drum lessons are one on one and held at a suitable time during school hours. Noel's aim is to get students playing along with as much music as possible (lots of songs!), as well as working on technique, various beats, and technical exercises.

Students will need a pair of drum sticks and a folder for music sheets to get started. Students progress much quicker if they have a drum kit or electronic drum kit to practice on, but is not essential to get started.

Year levels prep to 6. 20 min lessons =\$26 per lesson, half hour lessons = \$36 per lesson.
