Literacy

Reader's Workshop will begin this term with students having the opportunity to explore fiction and non-fiction texts. Students will be supported in understanding learning intentions through modelling of mentor texts before applying their knowledge in their own way, either from their personal bookbox or from the Epic! online library.

Learning intentions will focus on the 4 main elements of reading; comprehension, accuracy, fluency and expanding vocabulary. Class teachers will conduct reading conferences with students individually or in small groups to help students to reflect on their reading ability and set goals.

During Writing sessions this term students will continue to practise writing for sustained periods of time and be taught how to plan, draft and publish pieces of writing. We will focus on writing Recounts and Explanation texts.

Grammar will focus on the following: VCOP (Vocabulary, Connectives, Openers and Punctuation). We will also look at noun groups, paragraphs, tenses, proofreading and editing.

Spelling sessions will follow SMART Spelling scope and sequence and students will learn about a number of spelling rules.

Numeracy

This term during Mathematics sessions, we will be focusing on the following Number and Algebra curriculum areas: Addition, Multiplication, Subtraction, Division and Money

Curriculum areas of focus include: The CUBES problem solving strategy, Time, Area, Perimeter, Chance and Shape.
