Reading

In reading, students will be taking part in Reader's workshops.

The year has begun with a focus on how we select books, when to abandon books, what sustained reading looks like and sounds like.

Persuasive writing will also be covered this term as students learn about the acronym DAFORESTI to assist them in devices that will persuade the reader.


They will also be spending time recording reasons for and against a number of topics and structuring their texts with an introduction, 3 reasons and a conclusion.

Mathematics

In Term 1 students will begin with a focus on addition and subtraction, followed by data and statistics.
